FOREIGN SUPPLIER'S VERIFICATION PROGRAM (FSVP) – [REGISTER HERE](#)

This course will provide participants with the knowledge to implement the requirements of the FSVP for importers of food for humans and animals regulation of the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

Who should attend the FSVP course?

US-based importers who meet the definition of "importer" in the FSVP rule, which includes those who own or are the consignee of food at the time of entry, or, if no owner or consignee exists, the US agent or representative of the foreign owner.

Others who have an interest in ensuring that the requirements of the FSVP rule are met, including brokers, exporters, foreign suppliers of food that will be exported to the US, persons/business owners who currently buy food from foreign sources, and representatives of foreign governments.
